Maybe it was me, being at your website. :-D My parents had a look on your PDF and they knew much more people than I did! And they explained many things to me. Awesome work Hubert!

I'm very familiar with the history of Muggensturm. Nearly the whole maternal side of my mom and dad never lived anywhere else before. That's what the church records are saying. Sadly only until 1650... In 1622 nearly whole Muggensturm was burnt by Bavarian troops in the 30 year war and again in 1691 in another war. So many documents are lost! ☺

The church books which are left are available on [familysearch.org](https://www.familysearch.org), and if you take your private notebook and go to a research center, you get the original entries on top. Great thing! My advantage there is not only the German language, because it's also often in Latin, but I know the local names and the local history. So I can better judge if it could be true or what is maybe wrong. I already found a mistake in your tree yesterday, when I copied and tried to verify it.

I sent you an Ancestry.com invitation link to my tree, but you didn't accept it yet. My tree contains more than 4.000 people. Included you and Valerie of course !

The family names Unser and Zittel are very old local names, followed by Rastätter. You mentioned Johane Maulbach, maybe his correct name is Maulbetsch. I know from Fritz an Christel Maulbetsch, that they have relatives in NY area, and they have been there several times. The other names must be from other German area which doesn't mean that the people are not from Muggensturm.

I don't know a lady called Zimmermann? Maybe you have her contact data for me?

Valerie told me you have been in contact with a Muggensturm historic society? I don't know anything about that. Do you have a name or even several names?

Florida and Texas are next on our bucket list! We love travelling to the US! But due to Covid19 and our little boy (Maximilian is now 21 month old), travelling is postponed...

And in Texas, I have also a lot of relatives, but not from Muggensturm. As I said, only the maternal side of my parents is from Muggensturm. The paternal sides are from other areas in Germany, what the explanation is also, that I don't have a traditional Muggensturm family name like Valerie.
